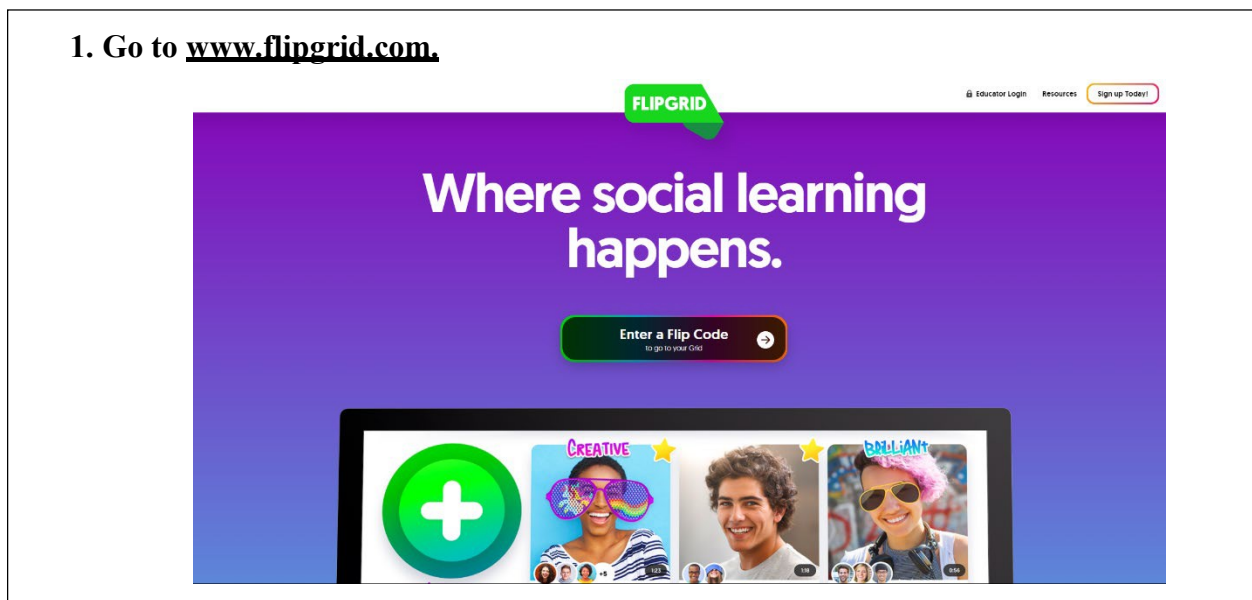


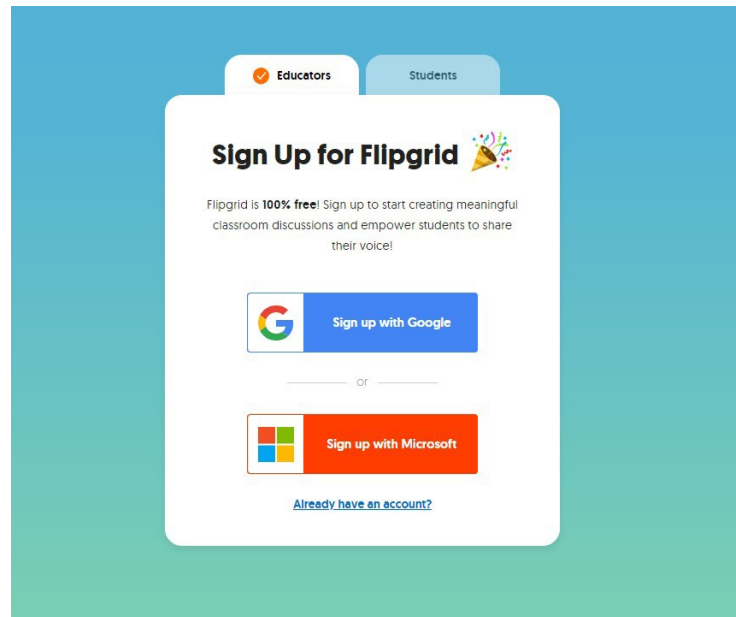
Technology Tools for Effective Online Teaching Practices: Flipgrid

Flipgrid is an asynchronous video technology that is free for educators. Flipgrid can be accessed on a computer or on a mobile device via the free app, which encourages mobile learning and can leverage student down time. Below are step-by-step directions for getting started with Flipgrid.

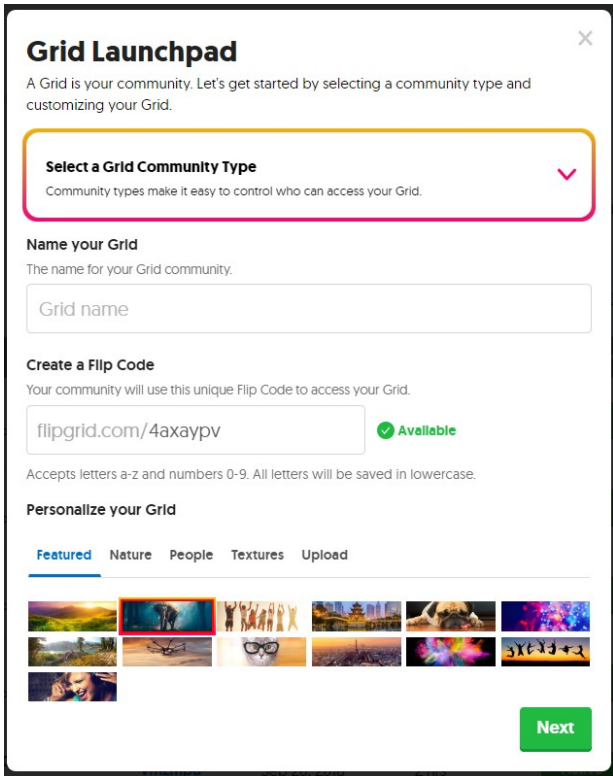
1. Go to www.flipgrid.com.



2. Create a FREE educator account using a Google or Microsoft email account.



3. Launch a new Grid – A Grid is like a digital classroom or community of learners.



Select a Grid Community type:

School Email Domain - Students enter the Flip Code and verify their school email using Microsoft or Google.

Student ID List - Students enter the Flip Code and input their Student ID # or scan a QR code for verification.

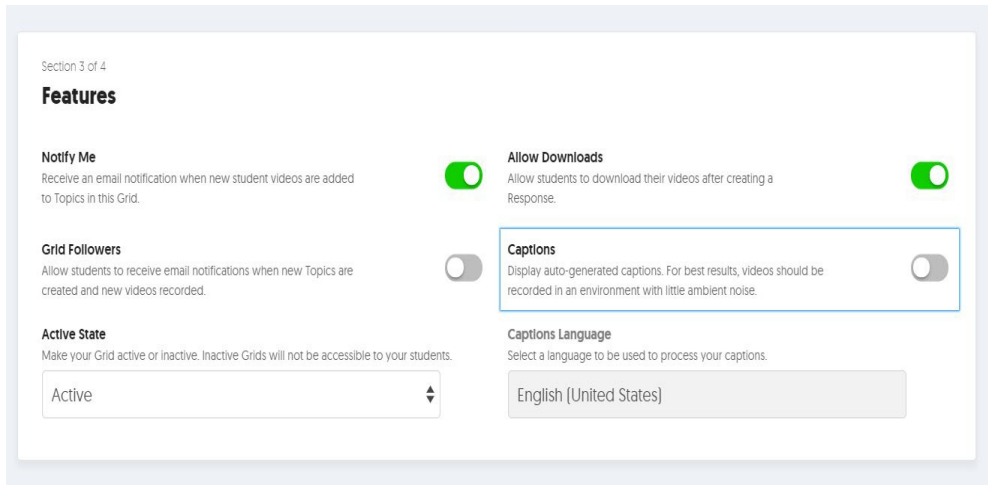
Professional Learning Community and Public - Allow anyone to view videos with just the Flip Code. To record a video, participants verify their email address via Microsoft or Google.

Name your Grid – Use the name of the course you are teaching or the learning objective.

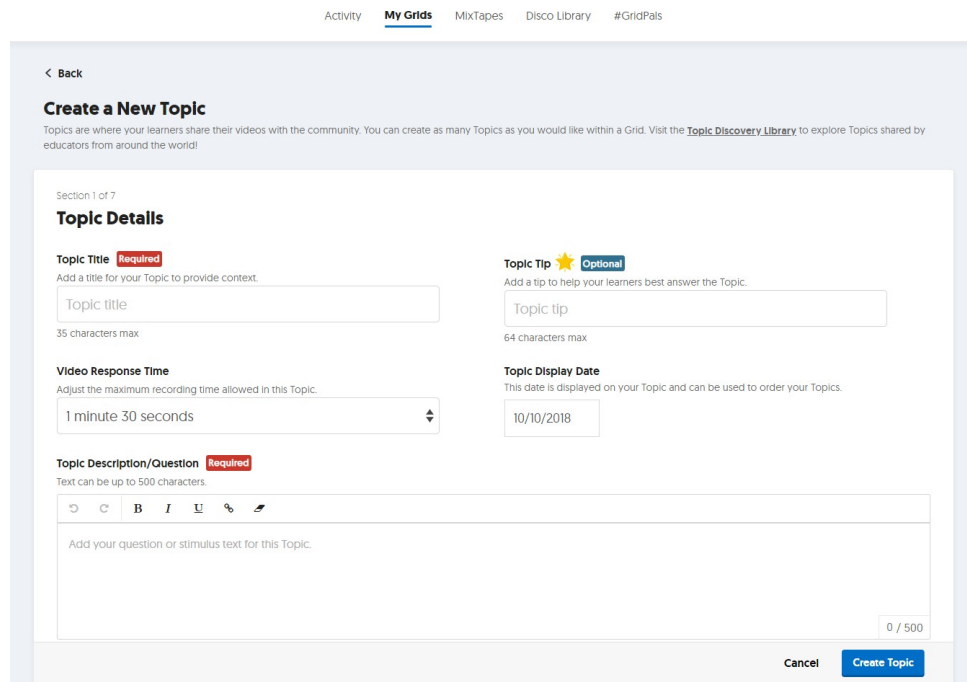
Personalize Your Grid – Upload a picture from your computer or use one of the free images provided.

Create a Flip Code – With Flipgrid, students do not create accounts. Educators provide students a Flip Code, and students enter this on the Flipgrid app or at flipgrid.com. Flip Codes can also be customized. Click here for more information:

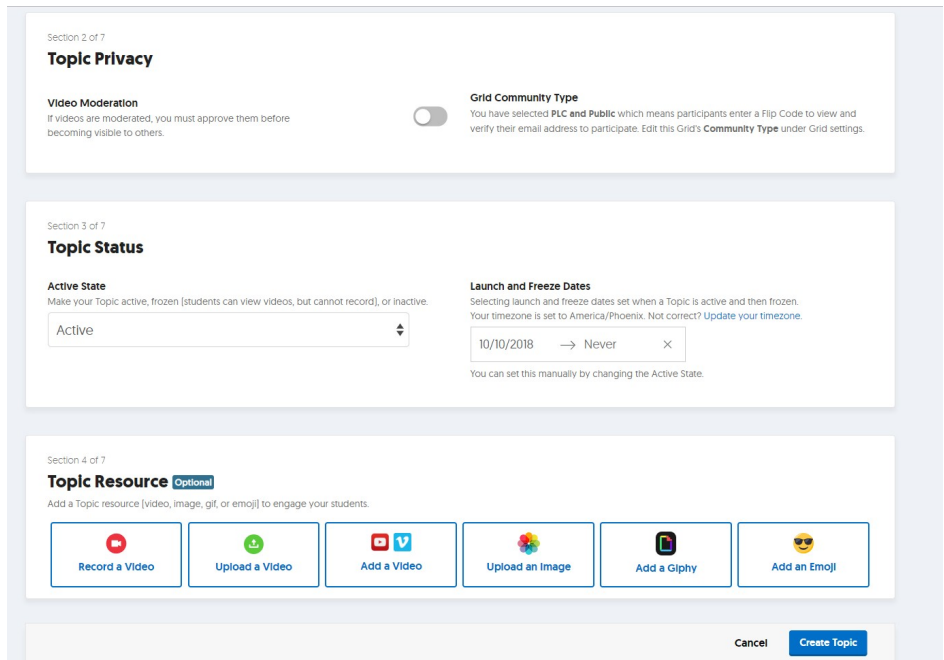
4. Set Grid Features – Flipgrid is ADA compliant; you can choose to turn on the captions for each video created. You also have the option to receive notifications when each student creates a new video.



5. Create a new topic – Once you create a Grid, you can also create topics within the Grid based on your learning objectives. You can set the video response time from 1 minute 30 seconds to 5 minutes.



6. Select topic settings – You have the option to moderate the videos created. You also have the option to upload a pre-recording video, image, document, or gif that you would like students to respond to.



7. Start the Conversation – Copy and paste the Flip Code link in an email, announcement, or post directly in the module on your Learning Management System.
